BA in English Institut für Anglistik und Amerikanistik

The BA in English is a three-year full-time course of study. English may be studied as a major field (Kernfachstudium) requiring a BA thesis or as a minor field (Ergänzungsfachstudium).

The BA program in English proceeds through three levels of increasing specialisation and scholarly sophistication:

In the 1st year of study, students gain a firm grounding in (1) English and American literature, (2) linguistics and (3) medieval English studies by attending an introductory module (Basismodul) in each of the three fields. In a fourth module, they develop their understanding of the characteristics of the English language and practice their English language skills. Final examinations are held at the end of the 1st year in all of the four modules.

In the 2nd year of study, students deepen their knowledge in areas of their own choice. They attend three modules in literature, linguistics, and/or medieval English studies and are required to submit work for assessment (Abschlussprüfungen) in two of these modules.

In the 2nd and 3rd years of study, students expand their knowledge either by specializing in a particular field within English or American studies or by continuing to take courses in the various disciplines represented in the institute. They are required to complete four modules and write a Bachelor's thesis that is related to the material covered in these courses. In one of the modules they must submit work for assessment (Abschlussprüfungen).

The BA program prepares students for a broad range of occupations, such as corporate communications, personnel management, publishing, and journalism.

Enrolment

The prerequisites are: A-levels (allgemeine or einschlägig gebundene Hochschulreife) and proficiency in the English language. BA courses start each winter term.

Master Courses in English Institut für Anglistik und Amerikanistik

The Department of English and American Studies at the Heinrich-Heine-Universität Düsseldorf offers two courses of study for a Masters degree:

1. Master of Arts in English
2. Master of Arts in Literary Translation

1. The Master of Arts in English

The MA in English is a two-year (four-semester) course of study with a strong commitment to teaching and student support that combines scholarly research with a strong occupational orientation. An applied language module that stresses oral presentation as well as academic and professional writing ensures that students' language skills meet the demands of the professions for which they are being prepared.

The MA in English offers courses in American Studies, Anglophone Literatures and Cultures, Modern English Literature and Culture, Medieval English Culture: Language and Literature and Linguistics. Masters students can either study the whole range of disciplines or specialise in one particular field of study. A degree program in Comparative Studies in English and American Language, Literature, and Culture is in preparation. Most of the teaching in the program takes place in seminars rather than lectures.

Degree requirements include assessment work (Abschlussprüfungen) in six modules and the Master's thesis. The program prepares students for a broad range of professions including corporate communications, personnel management, publishing, and journalism.

Enrolment

The prerequisites are: A BA certificate* in an appropriate subject with a grade point average of at least 2,5 (B) as well as the certificate of admission to a German university. Foreign applicants must prove their German language skills at DSH level.

*Applicants with other undergraduate university certificates must pass a qualifying examination.

2. The Master of Arts in Literary Translation

The MA in Literary Translation is a two-year (four-semester) course of integrated studies in English, one Romance language and German. It focuses on both theoretical and practical aspects of literary translation. The MA in Literary Translation consists of six interlinked modules from varied fields of study, such as literature, linguistics, cultural studies and translation studies combined with intensive practical training.

The target language is German.

The degree requirements include successful presentation of work for assessment (Abschlussprüfungen) in five modules and the Master's thesis. The teaching in the program takes place in seminars rather than lectures.

Enrolment

The necessary prerequisites are: a) A BA certificate* in one of the languages with a grade point average of at least 2,5 (B) as well as the certificate of admission to a German university. Foreign applicants must prove their German language skills at DSH level and b) All applicants must pass a written test in English, their chosen Romance Language and German.

*Applicants with other undergraduate university certificates must pass a qualifying examination.
