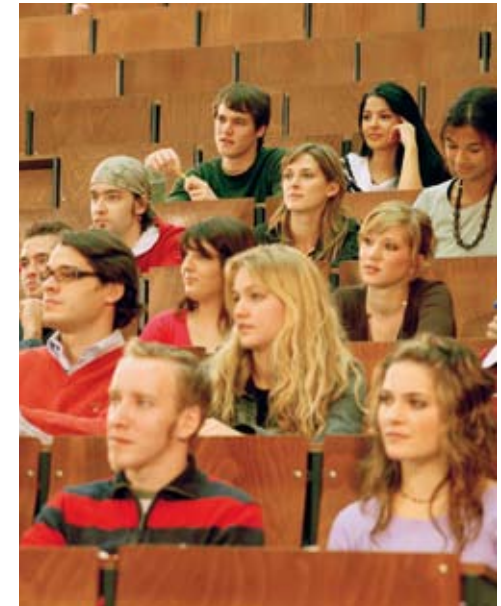

BA Course English

Anglistisches Institut

The BA English is a three year full-time course. English may be studied as a major (*Kernfachstudium*) including a BA thesis or as a minor program (*Ergänzungsfachstudium*).

The BA program English consists of three consecutive levels of growing specialisation and difficulty:

In the 1st year of study, students gain a firm grounding in (1) English and American literature, (2) linguistics and (3) medieval English studies by attending a basic module (Basismodul) in each of the three branches. In a fourth module, they develop a deeper understanding of the characteristics of the English language and practice their English language skills. In all of the four modules, final examinations are held at the end of the 1st year.

In the 2nd year of study, students deepen their knowledge in branches of their own choice. They attend three modules in literature, linguistics, and/or medieval English studies. In two of them they take an examination.

In the 2nd and 3rd years of study which are intended to expand knowledge, students are free to either go for a particular topic of their own choice or continue to study the whole range of disciplines. They attend four modules which lead to the Bachelor thesis. In one of the modules they take an examination.

Two practical English language modules form part of the BA course. Both modules end with a language examination.

Both English as a major and minor subjects include a certain number of courses of free choice (Wahlbereich).

The BA program prepares students for a broad occupational field, e.g. corporate communications, personnel departments, publishing, or journalism.

Enrolment

The necessary prerequisites are:

A-levels (allgemeine or einschlägig gebundene Hochschulreife) and proficiency in the English language.

BA courses start each winter term.

Master Courses

The English Department of the Heinrich-Heine-Universität Düsseldorf offers two master courses:

1. Master of Arts English

2. Master of Arts Literary Translation

1. The Master of Arts English

The MA English is a two year course (four terms) that combines research culture with a strong occupational orientation and general commitment to teaching and student support. One of its highlights are the integration of an applied language module with such topics as oral presentation, structures and skills etc.

The MA English offers courses in American Studies, Anglophone Literatures and Cultures, Modern English Literature and Culture, Medieval English Culture: Language and Literature and Linguistics. Master students can either study the whole range of disciplines or specialise in their field of study.

The exam comprises six module examinations and the master thesis. Teaching takes place in seminar groups which are run on a discussion rather than a lecture format.

The program provides access to a broad occupational field, e.g. corporate communications, personnel departments, publishing, or journalism.

Enrolment

The necessary prerequisites are:

A BA certificate* in an appropriate subject with a grade point average of at least 2,5 (B) as well as the certificate of admission to a German university. Foreign applicants have to prove their German language skills at DSH level.

*Applicants with other undergraduate university certificates will have to pass a qualifying examination.

2. The Master of Arts Literary Translation

The MA Literary Translation is a two year (four terms) course of integral studies in English, one Roman language (French, Italian or Spanish) and German. It focuses on theoretical and practical components equally.

The MA Literary Translation consists of six interlinked modules from varied fields of study, such as literature, linguistics, cultural studies, and translation studies combined with intensive practical training. The target language is German only.

The exam comprises five module examinations and the master thesis. Teaching takes place in seminar groups which are run on a discussion rather than a lecture format.

Enrolment

The necessary prerequisites are:

- a) A BA certificate* in one of the languages with a grade point average of at least 2,5 (B) as well as the certificate of admission to a German university. Foreign applicants have to prove their German language skills at DSH level and
- b) All applicants have to pass a written test in English, the Romance Language of their choosing and German.

*Applicants with other undergraduate university certificates will have to pass a qualifying examination.
