## **Concepts, prototypes and reasoning**

I will discuss the proposal that many concepts to be found as the meanings of nouns and verbs have prototype structure, and some of the philosophical objections to this idea. I will review evidence of how that prototype structure leads to reasoning and categorization judgments that deviate from logical norms. It is argued that such effects result from intensional combination of concept representations in a process that also relies on background world knowledge.
